

Quick Reference Guide to Housing on WAICU Campuses 2009-2010

Alverno College – Milwaukee

Alverno College requires all weekday college students entering the college within one year of their high school graduation who are single, with no dependents, to live on campus for their first two semesters unless the student is living with parents or a legal guardian.

Beloit College – Beloit

Beloit guarantees housing for four years, although seniors may live off campus. All students must live on campus for the first three years. The percentage of undergraduates living on campus is 95%.

Cardinal Stritch University – Milwaukee

Students are not required to live on campus, nor is housing guaranteed. However, to insure space for incoming students, we lease space in an apartment complex adjacent to the campus for some of our returning students. About 27% of the traditional student population lives on campus.

Carroll University – Waukesha

Carroll University guarantees housing to students. Students are required to live on campus for the first three years unless they are living with parents.

Carthage College – Kenosha

Students are required to live on campus until their senior year, and housing is guaranteed. Students can appeal to live off campus.

Concordia University Wisconsin – Mequon

Students are not required to live on campus, but housing is guaranteed for freshmen and new students, if they have applied for housing by August 1 and been accepted for admission. About 75% of undergraduates live on campus.

Edgewood College – Madison

All freshmen and sophomore, full-time, undergraduate students who do not live with a family member are required to live on campus. About 85% of freshmen and sophomore students live on campus.

Lakeland College – Sheboygan

All unmarried, full-time undergraduate students enrolled in traditional programs who are under the age of 21 are required to live on campus, unless they are living at home with a family member. Housing is guaranteed. About 67% of undergraduates live on campus.

Lawrence University – Appleton

Students are required to live on campus all four years, and housing is guaranteed. About 96% of undergraduates live on campus. Any student who has been out of high school for at least four years is exempt from this requirement.

Marian University – Fond du Lac

Freshmen and sophomores are required to live on campus unless they are living at home with parents within a reasonable commuting distance. Housing is guaranteed. About 40% of undergraduates live on campus.

Marquette University – Milwaukee

Students are required to live on campus for the first two years unless they live at home. Housing is guaranteed, so long as the student applies for it by May 1. Of freshmen, 93% live on campus.

Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design

Traditional freshmen who live more than 45 miles from the campus are required to live on campus the first year. Housing is guaranteed for students who are required to live at MIAD and send their tuition deposit by May 1. Approximately 65% of freshman undergraduates live on campus.

Milwaukee School of Engineering

Students are required to live on campus for the first two years unless they are living at home with parents within a 50-mile radius. Housing is guaranteed for the first two years.

Mount Mary College – Milwaukee

First-year students are required to live on campus if they are coming directly from high school and are not planning to live with immediate family members. Housing is guaranteed. About 56% of first-year students live on campus.

Northland College – Ashland

Freshmen and sophomores are required to live on campus and their housing is guaranteed. The percentage of undergraduates living on campus is about 60%.

Ripon College – Ripon

Students are required to live on campus all four years and housing is guaranteed. Approximately 87% of students live on campus.

St. Norbert College – De Pere

Students are required to live on campus for four years, though seniors can petition for off-campus living. Housing is guaranteed. Approximately 88% of students live on-campus.

Silver Lake College – Manitowoc

Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors are required to live in college housing adjacent to campus unless they live with immediate family members. That housing is guaranteed. The percentage of traditional, full-time undergraduates living on campus is 37%.

Viterbo University – La Crosse

Freshmen students who are entering directly from high school are required to live on campus, unless they are able to commute from and live with their parents. Housing is guaranteed to these freshmen.

Wisconsin Lutheran College – Milwaukee

Students are required to live on campus for all four years unless they are living at home with a family member or receive a waiver. Housing is guaranteed. The percentage of undergraduates living on campus is 80%.
