

## Quick Reference Guide to Housing on WAICU Campuses 2011-2012

### **Alverno College – Milwaukee**

Alverno College requires all weekday college students entering the college within one year of their high school graduation who are single, with no dependents, to live on campus for their first two semesters unless the student is living with parents or a legal guardian. Housing grants are available to those who qualify.

### **Beloit College – Beloit**

Beloit guarantees housing for four years, although seniors may live off campus. All students must live on campus for the first three years. The percentage of undergraduates living on campus is 95%.

### **Cardinal Stritch University – Milwaukee**

Students are not required to live on campus, nor is housing guaranteed. Upperclassmen may have the opportunity to live in an apartment complex adjacent to the campus and leased by the University. About one-third of the traditional student population lives on campus.

### **Carroll University – Waukesha**

Carroll University guarantees housing to freshmen. Students are required to live on campus for the first three years unless they are living with parents.

### **Carthage College – Kenosha**

Students are required to live on campus until their junior year, and housing is guaranteed. Students can appeal to live off campus.

### **Concordia University Wisconsin – Mequon**

Students are not required to live on campus. Housing is guaranteed for incoming freshman and transfer students if they have applied for housing by August 1. About 75% of undergraduates live on campus.

### **Edgewood College – Madison**

All full-time freshmen and sophomore undergraduate students who do not live with a family member are required to live on campus. About 85% of freshmen and sophomore students live on campus.

### **Lakeland College – Sheboygan**

All unmarried, full-time undergraduate students enrolled in traditional programs who are under the age of 21 are required to live on campus, unless they are living at home with a family member. Housing is guaranteed. About 67% of undergraduates live on campus.

### **Lawrence University – Appleton**

Students are required to live on campus, and housing is guaranteed. About 95% of undergraduates live on campus. Students who have been out of high school for more than four years (or are married and/or parents) are exempt from this requirement.

**Marian University – Fond du Lac**

Freshmen and sophomores are required to live on campus unless they are living at home with parents within a reasonable commuting distance. Housing is guaranteed. Approximately half of Marian's undergraduate students live on campus.

**Marquette University – Milwaukee**

Students are required to live on campus for the first two years unless they live at home. Housing is guaranteed, so long as the student applies for it by May 1. Of freshmen, 94% live on campus.

**Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design**

Traditional freshmen who live more than 45 miles from campus are required to live at The Park at 1824 (MIAD's Residence Hall) for the first year. Housing at The Park at 1824 is guaranteed for students who submit their tuition deposit, housing deposit and housing contract by May 1. Approximately 65% of freshman undergraduates live on campus.

**Milwaukee School of Engineering**

Students are required to live on campus for the first two years unless they are living at home with parents within a 50-mile radius. Housing is guaranteed for the first two years.

**Mount Mary College – Milwaukee**

First-year students are required to live on campus if they are coming directly from high school and are not planning to live with immediate family members. Housing is guaranteed. About 44% of first-year students live on campus.

**Northland College – Ashland**

Freshmen and sophomores are required to live on campus and their housing is guaranteed. The percentage of undergraduates living on campus is about 60%.

**Ripon College – Ripon**

Students are required to live on campus all four years unless they receive a waiver of this requirement. Housing is guaranteed. Approximately 90% of students live on campus.

**St. Norbert College – De Pere**

Students are required to live on campus all four years and housing is guaranteed. Seniors can petition for off-campus living. Approximately 88% of students live on-campus.

**Silver Lake College – Manitowoc**

Silver Lake College guarantees housing for four years, although seniors may live off campus. All students must live on campus for the first three years, unless the student is living with parents or a legal guardian. Students live in new on-campus housing, Clare Hall. The majority of rooms are singles, with suite-style housing available.

**Viterbo University – La Crosse**

Freshmen students who are entering directly from high school are required to live on campus, unless they are living with their parents.

**Wisconsin Lutheran College – Milwaukee**

Any student who graduated from high school three or more years ago may live off campus. Students who live with family members within a 50-mile radius of the college may also choose to live off campus. All other students are required to live in college housing unless they have exceptional circumstances for which they can apply for an exemption from the housing policy. Approximately 75% of WLC students reside on campus.
